DODGY PARKING A HAZARD

As the dark nights draw in, it is important to note that this is the most dangerous period of the year for traffic accidents involving children.

A number of parents and residents have expressed concerns about safety outside the front of the school. Comments include concerns about illegal parking and inconsiderate parking and dangerous driving along Burton's Way.

To help keep pupils safe on the walk to and from school, please consider the following advice;

- Ensure that younger pupils are directly supervised at all times
- Wear bright or reflective clothing, particularly if riding a bike. On bikes, lights are needed at dusk.
- Be aware of children on scooters—if your child is riding on the roadway, stop them.
- PARK ONLY IN THE DESIGNATED SPOTS
- Do not park in front of the school.

Please do not park on the driveways of local residents. It is worth noting that boys are far more likely than girls to be involved in an accident. Also the risk actually goes up as the children get older (ie 12+ years).

Attendance levels have remained high so far, with the overall attendance level standing at 96%.
