What is safeguarding?

Parents/carers and visitors coming onto our school premises, including the playground and inside the buildings, have a duty of care towards the welfare and safety of the children and the adults at the school, this is called safeguarding.

Safeguarding means that:-

- Children are protected from mistreatment.
- A child's health, or development, is protected.
- Children grow up with safe and effective care.
- Action is taken to ensure the best outcomes for all children.

Safeguarding is the action we take to promote the welfare of children in our care and to protect them from harm, **we take this very seriously.**

Child Protection

This is the process of protecting children who may be suffering from, or at risk of, significant harm. This includes physical abuse, sexual abuse, neglect and emotional harm.

Child protection promotes the rights and welfare of all children. All schools have staff responsible for Child Protection concerns. These staff are responsible for speaking to parents if concerns arise, and making referrals to Children's Social Care with, or without, parental permission. Security

We ensure that your child is taught in a safe and secure environment by:-

- Having one entranceway to the school building for visitors and ensuring all visitors sign in and

out, and wear a visitors badge at all times.

- Regular Health and Safety checks being undertaken by our governors and staff.
- Risk assessments being carried out by teaching staff prior to any off site visits.
- Having secure playgrounds which are fenced and gates locked.
- Having termly fire drills take place.

Attendance

Your child's attendance is monitored daily and significant absences are always followed up by the Education Welfare Service. Once your child is registered at school you are legally responsible for making sure that they attend regularly.
